Kintalkyo bridge

This bridge was first built in 1673 by KikkawaHiroyoshi, the third-generation feudal lord of Iwakuni. The current bridge was constructed by the fourth-generation feudal lord. A wooden bridge with five arches, it straddles the clear waters of the Nishiki River and measures 193.3 meters long and 5 meters wide. It is constructed by a combination of wood and C-shaped hoop iron girder binders, and clamps are used. *20 min. via car from berth (7km)

lwakuni Art Museum

Located a 10 minutes' walk from Kintaikyo Bridge, Iwakuni Art Museum exhibits a collection of ancient armor and weapons that is among the best in Japan. The collection of approximately 6,000 items includes porcelain ware, glass crafts, calligraphy, armor, swords, battle coats, and harnesses dating from the Nara Period to the Edo Period. Approximately 200 items are on permanent display, including the Battle of Kawanakashima and Battle Array of the Takeda Army 8-part folding screens. The museum earned a star in the Michelin Green Guide Japan. *10 min. walk from Kintaikyo

KURE Port (Hiroshima Pref.)



The Kure Port is located north of the Geiyo Islands at the east entrance of Hiroshima Bay near the center of the Seto Inland Sea. Before the war, it was home to a naval shipyard, and it developed as a naval port. After the war, shipbuilding, steel, machine metal, pulp and other companies set up operations on the coast, and the foundation was established for a coastal industrial zone. There is a self-defense force base in the Showa district where submarines can be viewed up close, and on the weekends, military vessels are open to the public. There are many tourist facilities in the central district, including the Yamato Museum, which has a one-tenth scale reproduction of the battleshipYamato , and the Iron Whale Museum, which has retired submarines on display.

Yamato Museum

(Kure Maritime Museum)

On exhibit here you will find a detailed onetenth scale reproduction of the Yamato battleship built in Kure as well as an actual Zero fighter plane and a "Kaiten" human torpedo. The history of Kure is recounted using panels and artifacts. There is also an exhibition room where principles of ships and other scientific technologies are explained using ship steering simulators and other tools, so the whole family can enjoy a trip to the museum.

Akinada Tobishima Kaido cycling

The Akinada Tobishima Kaido cycling course is popular because it has a low sea wall that allows you to enjoy the natural and pleasant scenery of the Seto Inland Sea while riding along the course. There are places scattered about the islands where you can learn about history like the Mitarai area with buildings from the Edo period (1603-1867) and onsen to enjoy. Take a ride and stop by some of these places!

HIROSHIMA Port (Hiroshima Pref.)



The Hiroshima Port is located on the Seto Inland Sea, which is famous the world over for its beautiful coastlines and islands. The Uiina Foreign Trade Wharf is 280 meters long and 10 meters deep and offers convenient access to many appealing tourist spots, including the Itsukushima Shrine and the Atomic Bomb Dome. Tourist information is provided in foreign languages at the information center next to the wharf, and there is also free wi-fi service available. By popular demand, there are also currency exchange services and shuttle buses. You can also enjoy "kagami-biraki" (opening of a cask of sake at a party or ceremony) and other traditional cultural attractions as part of the hospitality. In 2014, the Itsukaichi Wharf (430-m long and 12-m deep) will be completed, allowing 100,000-ton class passenger ships to make port calls as well

FUKUYAMA Port (Hiroshima Pref.)



The Fukuyama Port is located near the center of the Seto Inland Sea and has developed as the main port for the eastern area of Hiroshima. Opened for service in 2005, the Fukuyama Port International Container Terminal has two 170-meter long, 10-meter deep guays. It serves as the main international distribution base in the prefecture and is used for multiple purposes, including in recent years events in which large sailing ships make port calls. To the west of the port, Tomonoura is home to the kind of picturesque scenery that the Setonaikai National Park is known for. It has long flourished through domestic and international trade, and there are many historical sites and architectural remains to see. You can get to Tomonoura by land or stop at an offshore 16-meter deep anchorage and take a ferry.

Tomonoura and Sensuijima Island

Since old times, Tomonoura flourished as a port town where ships could wait for a favorable tide, and the townscape and port facilities have retained their appearance from the Edo period (1603-1867). In recent years, it has also become famous as the location that inspired animation director Hayao Miyazaki's Ponyo and that served as the setting for Hollywood's The Wolverine.

Just five minutes away by the Heisei IrohaMaru municipal ferry, Sensui Island is a picturesque place where you can enjoy pristine nature.

Fukuyama Castle and Fukuyama Culture Zone

Fukuyama Castle was built in 1619 when Katsunari Mizuno became lord of the Bingo domain. The Fushimi Yagura Turret and SujiganeGomon Gate are designated Important Cultural Properties. Inside the keep, personal effects and materials belonging to the lords of the castle, archaeological and historic items, and other collections are on exhibit. Various facilities, including an art museum, a history museum, and a literary museum are located within the vicinity, and it is a verdant space where citizens go to rest.
